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The items below are copied from "The Catalogue of K-Vowel-N Words of the World," which currently (January, 2006) is online at the *Etymology to the Maximum* website, <http://www.lionsgrip.com/etym.html> . The author created this catalogue over a three-year period, finishing in 1992. It is in spreadsheet format, and interested readers are encouraged to try to find one of the versions that opens on your computer. With it, you can sort the columns any way you like: by the words themselves, by language, by Meanings, etc.

A ***Meaning***, as used in this study, is a generally-used human concept that is evidenced by KVN words found among numerous language groups throughout the world. Meanings are seen to group themselves around even more general concepts, as arranged in this presentation. These more-general concepts are designated as ***Clusters*** and ***Sub-Clusters***. These are not fixed groupings, but, like any scientific key, can be equally successful under many different groupings and arrangements.

The Rods cluster is perhaps the least "correct" of all the Clusters ~ the Sub-Clusters in it may not all belong here. But I had to get the study printed even though it was not finished (the owner wanted his laptop back ~ that was in the early days of laptops, and he was quite protective of his). One example of something that doesn't seem to belong are bent things. I put them here because if making a rod involved the concept of perfect straightness, then the opposite ~ something "bent" ~ might be expected here. Then there is the idea of the head, tip, summit ~ I'll leave this to you to decide if it belongs with the Rods, or elsewhere.

This is listed first only because we're using alphabetical order. It requires some familiarity with other Rods concepts to see the connection (if indeed there is a connection). I am speculating that the snake was seen as a version of the Rod, but in a special bent condition (vs the true rod-like condition). Hmm let's see, could this possibly be phallic?

Whether from the snake or not, the "bent" condition manifests in several ways, including cords, which should probably be included in the Snake-Like sub-cluster. I was too hasty!
